## A-1. Fuzzy Resemblances—Sucharita Ranganathan (Bangalore).

Fuzzy relations have been defined on ordinary sets and on fuzzy sets. A fuzzy relation R which is reflexive and symmetric is called a resemblance relation or a proximity or a tolerance relation. The complement of a resemblance is a dissemblance. This paper presents results on resemblance relations. In particular, the conditions under which the compositions of resembances are again resemblances are investigated.

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## PROFESSOR (Dr.) C.S. VENKATARAMAN A BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE (1918 - 1994)



#### 1. INTRODUCTION

Professor C. S. Venkataraman, popualrly known as C.S.V. was an eminent mathematician and a dedicated teacher. He had been a towering

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
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
